GUINNESS WORLD RECORD



In this lyric piece of Flash Fiction, Publicover takes on the history of our country's brutal relations between the government authorities an the First Nation's people. Not an easy subject for any writer, and yet she does so confidently in the span of two succinct pages. In such a short space, Publicover resists the urge to simplify, stereotype or glibly address the pain of such a history.

Instead through the use of imagery and analepsis she creates a beat throughout the story that mimics the beat of a drum. With each paragraph the reader feels the blow of her words, the reality of it's narrator's unfolding awareness, and the loss of its subject with ever increasing weight. Through the use of imagery, fresh language, and practiced construction, "Drums" delivers a profound and haunting experience that lingers. For the third consecutive year, CanTeach has been the grateful recipient of proceeds from your charity collections. CanTeach Connections Inc. is a locally-based organization which assists with the teaching and learning of English in El Salvador. JAPAN STUDENT EXCHANGE PROGRAM—2017

Parent Meeting

The Waterloo Catholic District School Board will embark on our first exchange with Yamate Gakuin High School in Yokohama, Japan which is dedicated to world peace. The Waterloo Catholic District School Board (WCDSB) is pleased to partner with Yamate Gakuin as a pilot project in 2017. The international exchange involves two aspects

- 80 85 students from Japan will visit Waterloo Region from Friday April 14, 2017 to Friday April 28, 2017 and will be hosted by local families.
- Student from the Waterloo Catholic District School Board will then travel to Japan from Friday July 21 to Friday August 4, 2017 and will be hosted by local families.

The volunteer teacher team, with the support of the RDO international team, will help organize the Japanese visit and a number of planned activities for Japanese students visiting the Waterloo Region and the Canadian

exchange student. Visiting students will attend one of our Waterloo Catholic District secondary schools and each school community will organize local events and activities for their visiting students.

Canadian students travelling to Japan will have a cultural experience of a lifetime. Yamate Gakuin High School and families will host a welcome ceremony and Cultural Day. There are three excursions planned for the North American students including a tour of Yokohama, Tokyo and Tokyo Disneyland. The Yokohama experience



includes visiting the historic Sankei-En Gardens and Hakkeijima Sea Paradise. During their excursion to Tokyo students will take a river cruise on the Sumida River, visit Sensō-ji Temple which is the oldest Buddhist temple in Toyko, and a trip to the Edo Tokya museum. The final excursion is to Tokyo Disneyland.

The cost of this experience is \$3,500 which includes: flight, airport transportation, travel insurance, excursions in Japan, accommodations and meals.
