

Liam Dietrich shows off his **cashless vending machine** which uses an RFID reader, keypad, stepper motor, and Arduino.



Jessica Wormald built a robotic vacuum cleaner and floor mopper using ultrasound sensors, H-bridges, motors, an Arduino, and a lot of mechanical prototyping.




Dion Grobe & Ohanes Sukjian created a **wireless telemetry system** that can transmit carbon monoxide (CO) levels and GPS coordinates several hundred meters to a receiving station.



Dakota Atkinson & Sebastian Misiak created an Arduinobased custom MIDI (musical instrument digital interface) controller that can use any kind of sensor to control a PCbased synthesizer.



Paul Han created an **online computer parts store** complete with wish lists and predictive search using WordPress and numerous e-commerce plugins.



Jordan Murray & Alex Winter built an Arduino-controlled LED matrix display using an Arduino Mega and a lot of soldering and coding.



Kol Gang built an **electronic Tic-Tac-Toe board** using an ingenious technique that had each Arduino pin connect to both a momentary pushbutton switch input and an LED output that toggles on/off under software control.
