Accessing Student Supports

COVID-19 and this time of physical distancing has forced all of us to make changes and adapt, and sometimes we can feel alone and not know where to find support to help us through these challenges.

We want you to know that, just like we would be in the building, your Guidance Counselor, Student Success/ Special Education team, and ESL monitors are committed to helping you and will be available virtually to support you. So please know these services are still available, we have established an online presence called "St. David Student Supports" to support your learning needs during this new method of learning.

Members of our support team are available to assist you daily using an online virtual meeting tool called Microsoft teams.

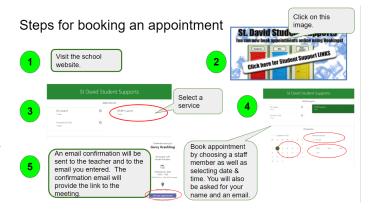
We can assist with a variety of needs including:

- help you work through questions using a virtual whiteboard
- · review content material with you
- clarify assignment or task expectations for you
- assist you with technological issues you may be experiencing with D2L or Google Classroom
- answer subject-specific questions
- provide online coaching and help you create a schedule

This is just a sample of how we can help you. So next time you are staring at the screen and are not sure how to tackle your new assignment, why not book an appointment with the St. David Student Supports Team, and we will do our best to meet your learning needs. Simply visit the St. David website https://stdavid.wcdsb.ca/ and click on the "St. David Student Supports" image on the main page to book an appointment. This will take you to our bookings page where you will select a service (Guidance, Special Education/Student Success, ESL) and can book a specific time-slot during the school day that fits your schedule. You and a Support Teacher will then be notified that a booking has been

created for that time, and you will be provided with a link to join a Microsoft Teams meeting. You can then join at the booked time to virtually meet and receive assistance (please see the graphic outlining this process here).

(Note: If you are using your wcdsb email address to book an appointment it is the last five digits of your student and the first three letters of your last name@wcdsbcloud.ca)



Student Learning Information

Learning Management System (LMS) – this is either Google or D2L – students can find their assignments, calendar, announcements, and more for each of their classes.

Virtual Meetings – Teams or Google is your video conferencing platform. When students are at home, log into all of your classes at the start of the period for directions, lessons and assignments for the day.

Attendance – is taken every day, in all Face to Face classes as well as in your online afternoon class. Don't forget to log in.

Instruction – will be synchronous (live) and asynchronous (pre-recorded; assignments, videos, tutorials, etc.) and will vary depending on whether you are in school or at home. Your teachers are here to make sure everyone is learning!

Social & Emotional Learning – your well being is most important. We will work hard to develop relationships and build them throughout the course. Your teachers and support staff are here to help!

COVID Test/Screening & Outbreak Protocol

All students (or guardians on their behalf) will be asked to engage in a daily self-assessment before reporting to school and anyone feeling unwell or identifying a concern based on their self-assessment should not report to school. https://covid-19.ontario.ca/self-assessment/)

Entry Procedures ~ how to move around the building

- Upon entering the school students are required to wear a mask and sanitize their hands, while maintaining a social distance.
- Students are not to congregate in groups and are asked to promptly move to their morning class upon arrival.
- When traveling within the school, all signage and directions must be observed and followed.
- Should a student need to use the washroom, they are to use the facility within their assigned Village.
- All students will be required to wear mask at all times.
- Students are to sanitize their hands upon entering and leaving the classroom.

How do I Change Learning Environments

When we began the school year back in early September, the board announced that the first transition point for families to switch their children from virtual learning to face to face learning (or vice versa) would be the Thanksgiving weekend. In secondary schools, families/students may only transfer between learning modalities at the end of the quad (November is the next opportunity) – the window for switching will occur starting **Monday**, **October 19**th **at 9am** and will close at **6pm on Wednesday**, **October 21**st.

At the core of LINK lies the belief that kindness can transform anxiety and fear into feelings of excitement, hope, and trust. Together, as a community of faith, LINK leaders and school staff will do everything they can to ensure the future class of 2024 grow to be caring, resilient individuals.

COVID-19: Recognizing Changes, Accepting Losses, & Finding Hope

Put simply, COVID-19 has changed the world- and it's people- along with it. When schools were shuttered back in March, students and staff from all grade levels could never have imagined classes would be going online for the duration of the school year. Being in lockdown was difficult, especially for those of us who thrive on routine and social interaction.

The feelings that accompany the changes and losses brought on by COVID-19 can be painful and difficult. Please refrain from being critical to yourself over any feelings of sadness, grief, anxiety, anger... It is normal and healthy to feel grief over a loss. Be kind to yourselves. Take a quiet

moment to reflect. Acknowledge the feelings left behind from lockdown and feelings that are springing up as a new school year has begun. Next, work to label your feelings. The simple practice of writing out our pleasant and unpleasant emotions can help us gain self-awareness. Once we recognize our feelings, we make room for new, positive emotions and memories to grow. The best part? When we quit running from our feelings, we come to see that we are strong enough to handle them.

Helpful Strategies

When you find yourself feeling anxious, disappointed, or down, it can be helpful to have a set of activities and skills to help you shift your mood and start feeling better. Here is a list of strategies/distraction activities to get you started:

- Read a book by an author you love
- Journal/write
- Listen to upbeat music
- Go for a walk in nature
- · Ride your bike
- Clean your bedroom
- Organize vour belongings
- Cook or bake your favourite food
- Set a SMART goal and work towards it daily
- Brew tea
- Meditate
- · Practice yoga
- Play with/cuddle your pet
- · Do a random act of kindness

- · Call or text a friend or family member
- · Draw, paint, or knit
- · Make a list of things you are grateful for
- Identify a positive habit you want in your life (for example, exercising daily)
- · Get enough sleep
- Go for a run outside
- Help someone in need
- Complete a task you've been putting off
- · Feed ducks, squirrels, or birds
- Make a list of the positives in your life
- Volunteer (remember, you need 40 hours to graduate!)
- · Read inspirational quotes

The activities and skills listed above may prove useful when you are feeling overwhelmed or upset. Still, it is important to remember that if you continue to feel unwell despite regular use of your skills, reaching out to a trusted parent, adult, or friend can get you back to feeling like yourself. Remember; you are not alone in your struggle. Every person you meet is facing- or will face- their own challenges. We are all in this together, so let's help one another thrive!

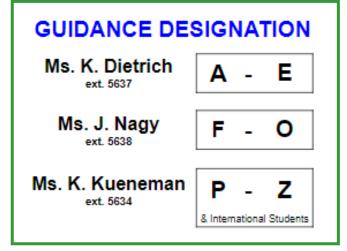

How do I mark a junked email as safe?

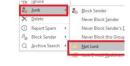
Note: some email applications may have a slightly different process to mark emails as 'Safe'.

Step 1: Open your e mail application and click the Junk or Spam Email folder

Step 2: Find the email you wish to mark as safe (always receive in Inbox) and right-click on it.

Step 3: Select Junk and then click Not Junk

The email will be marked as "not junk" and returned to your Inbox. Future email like this will not be sent to your Junk Folder.

Parent/Visitor Access

Parents are valued members of school communities but given the many increased steps that are being taken to minimize contacts in our school buildings, parents should refrain from entering the school unless they have prior approval to do so. All parents/visitors must have approval from the Administrator prior to entering the site.

Visitors granted access are required to wear a face covering to enter the school and sanitize hands upon entry. Where possible visitors are asked to call the main office to notify them of their arrival and wait outside away from the entrance, or in their vehicle until the office is ready to receive them.
