
Let us continue to pray for God's grace and blessings on the St. David family.

Attention St. David Community of Parents and Students:

Does this pandemic have you feeling a little more stressed than usual when it comes to finding success academically? Not sure where to turn for help?

Obviously COVID-19 has forced all of us to adapt and find new ways of doing things, and that's exactly what your Student Success Team at St. David has done. We know you can't drop into Room 229 for extra help or for tutoring, but you can arrange to meet with a Student Support Teacher online through Microsoft Teams.

So whether you have an IEP, need support with English as a second language, or just need help to complete a task, just follow these simple steps below, and it can connect you with the academic help you need!

- Visit the school website https://stdavid.wcdsb.ca/
 From the main page, look for this icon:
- Click on St. David Student Supports link (the picture with the coloured doors).
- From there, students can create a booking with specific services, including Special Education/ Student Success.
- When creating a booking, students must select the service, and then enter their name and school email address (@wcdsbcloud.ca).



• Once created, a notification will be sent to the student's email, as well as to the Support Teacher that the booking has been created.

We encourage all students to use this support, especially during the ASYNCHRONOUS days (those Remote Learning from Home days) when they are not Face-to-Face with their teacher in the building.


To find your schedule:





Receiving email from the school

How do I mark a junked email as safe?

Note: some email applications may have a slightly different process to mark emails as 'Safe'.

- Step 1: Open your e mail application and click the Junk or Spam Email folder
- **Step 2:** Find the email you wish to mark as safe (always receive in Inbox) and right-click on it.
- Step 3: Select Junk and then click Not Junk

The email will be marked as "not junk" and returned to your Inbox. Future email like this will not be sent to your Junk Folder.

Entry Procedures ~ how to move around the building

- Upon entering the school students are required to wear a mask and sanitize their hands, while maintaining a social distance.
- Students are not to congregate in groups and are asked to promptly move to their morning class upon arrival.
- When traveling within the school, all signage and directions must be observed and followed.
- Should a student need to use the washroom, they are to use the facility within their assigned Village.
- All students will be required to wear mask at all times.
- Students are to sanitize their hands upon entering and leaving the classroom.

Transportation Information & Notifications

Inclement Weather (unsafe driving conditions)

In the event of an inclement weather day being declared, and the buses are cancelled due to the weather and unsafe driving conditions, the schools will be closed and students will have a remote learning day. Teachers will post work in the morning, no later than 10 a.m. and students will work on their own timing in their home. This will allow all students to access learning and we will be continuing to keep one and all safe. Teachers will be available during normal bell times on the closure day via email as well as through the class D2L or Google Classroom site.

Advent....it has many meanings, depending how you have come to understand it.

To youth, Advent means planning, shopping (and hopefully mostly online shopping this year), decorating trees, wrapping presents and eating shortbread.

To teachers it means balancing teaching, planning, family time, decorating and a lot of financial and social obligations.

To the church it means waiting... awaiting the birth of our savior. A quiet time of preparation as we wait for Emmanuel.

We are to slow down and at the same time we are to be actively waiting. How does that work? Actively waiting? Well, we can wait passively (i.e. do nothing) or we can wait expectantly. And to be active in our waiting we have hope....we know it is coming.

Just like our mother Mary when she found out she was with child. She was expecting a baby. She carries inside her the promise of a savior, and even though she cannot see it, she knows it is there. The moment she learns of her pregnancy, she begins to plan for her baby's arrival. She actively prepares for the arrival of the baby because she knows the promise will be fulfilled—it is just a matter of time. She is expectant, and she will wait as long as it takes. And she had to do some major active waiting — not too many people would be able to travel in our last month of pregnancy on a donkey and sleep in a stable.

So how does the new chaplain of St. David's understand Advent? To me, Advent means accompaniment.

'Each young person's heart should thus be considered "holy ground", a bearer of seeds of divine life before which we must 'take off our shoes" in order to draw near and enter more deeply into the Mystery' Christus Vivit, 67

Like the image of a gardener...a gardener can till soil, plant seeds, water the plants, provide fertilizer, remove weeds, control pests...but it cannot make the plants grow. It is a wonderful metaphor for me as gardening is my passion.

So as your chaplain and as we prepare for Advent I will be the gardener who will accompany the seeds of faith and pray they grow into the beautiful and fruitful staff and students who you are meant to be.

When people patiently and expectantly wait on God in the midst of horrible circumstances (especially during this time of the worldwide Pandemic and the possibility of another lockdown), suddenly God breaks through.

This Advent don't give up! Join me in actively waiting for Christmas. Find someone with whom you can accompany on their journey. Stay full of hope and expectation. God's power is limitless, and He'll break through for you.

Financial Supports

New Ontario "Support for Learners" Financial Assistance Program

On November 30, the Ontario government launched the Support for Learners program. Through this program, the government is providing financial support to help parents and guardians with additional costs during the 2020-2021 school year, during the second wave of COVID-19.

Eligible parents or guardians will receive a one-time payment of: \$200 for each child up to age 12 \$250 for each child or youth up to age 21 years with special needs



This is a new program, and all parents or guardians who are residents of Ontario with eligible children will need to submit a new application for each child.

As of today, eligible parents or guardians can go to Ontario.ca/SupportforLearners for more information and to apply for the one-time financial support. The deadline to apply is January 15, 2021.

Support for Learners funding is intended to directly support parents to provide children and youth with key educational resources like workbooks, school supplies, technology and developmental resources during these unprecedented times.
