


A Message from our Leadership Team...

Students will be completing their final evaluations in person. As outlined by the Ministry of Education, a final evaluation does not need to be an examination and is administered at or towards the end of the course to allow students an opportunity to demonstrate achievement of the overall expectations. Teachers can provide a broad range of culminating activities for the final evaluation to allow students to demonstrate their learning. Possible options may include a performance, an essay, a test, a debrief of the course, a presentation, individually scheduled exit interviews or another method of evaluation suitable to the course content.

Buses will run according to their regular schedule in the morning and will depart school at 10:25 am after class on November 10th and 11th.

Quad 2 begins November 15 (Q2 = Periods 3 & 4)

Ontario Secondary School Literacy Test

St. David will be providing an opportunity for students in Grade 10 and 11 (as well as non-graduating 12s) to write the Ontario Secondary School Literacy Test (OSSLT) this November. The OSSLT measures whether students are meeting the minimum standard for literacy across all subjects up to the end of Grade 9. Successful completion of the literacy test is one of the requirements to earn an Ontario Secondary School Diploma. However, as a result of the learning disruption caused by the pandemic the literacy graduation requirement for all students graduating during the 2021–2022 school year has been waived, so graduating students do not need to take the OSSLT.

The administration of the OSSLT for Grade 10, 11, and non-graduating Grade 12 students will take place on...

Important Information for Grade 12 Students Community Service Hours

Students are required to earn 40 hours of Community Service as a graduation requirement. Due to the pandemic, students may count the following towards their community involvement hours:

- -up to 10 hours of paid employment if a student is 14 years or older and completes a reflection exercise demonstrating how their work contributed to their community
- -community involvement during school time, for example, walking a younger child to and from school or helping younger siblings with school work
- -duties normally performed at home, for example, helping an elderly relative with errands or providing after school care for a sibling

Receiving email from the school

How do I mark a junked email as safe?

Note: some email applications may have a slightly different process to mark emails as 'Safe'.

Step 1: Open your e mail application and click the Junk or Spam Email folder

Step 2: Find the email you wish to mark as safe (always receive in Inbox) and right-click on it.

Step 3: Select *Junk* and then click *Not Junk*

The email will be marked as "not junk" and returned to your Inbox. Future email like this will not be sent to your Junk Folder.

Getting Back in the Groove.....I'm back.

GETTING BACK INTO THE GROOVE WITH GOD

In an almost two-year hiatus from "normal" St. David's is back in the groove. For me? I've been out of practice being an effective chaplain due not only the Pandemic, but also due to the intense busyness of the season before that fateful March 13, of 2020 when we went into lockdown.

After the shock, adjusting and transferring to St. David from a very busy and large school, I was in a funk....I had lost my groove. As your chaplain I have so many ways to interact with students and last year I virtually had none (unless you consider virtual ministering a thing for high school). And not only had I lost my groove as a high school chaplain I lost my groove when it came to my faith.... watching masses online was convenient as I wore my pajamas, slouched on the couch, drinking coffee. It occurs to me that faith and trust in God is a lot like that.... getting the core of our souls in line so that the rest can just sort of take a life on of its own.

We can stress about the rules of religion, the various ins, and outs of the "Catholic/Christian/Separate Schools" debate and all of that, but in the end, faith boils down to trust and the posture of our souls. We need to know the freedom to understand the source of life as it comes to us, just as your chaplain (and teachers) seek freedom from our anxiety to allow our souls to reconnect with the groove of ministering, of teaching and finding our God in a new post pandemic way.

It is so wonderful to be the chaplain of St. David, ministering to all of God's children. Indeed, it is good to be back in the groove. How about you?

For many students, athletics have always provided a much needed outlet, and have enriched their high school experience by providing them with not only physical activity and an opportunity for social interaction, but a venue for developing teamwork skills,


